This template may include all new pledges arising since the close of the previous 2021-22 pledging exercise (i.e. since 30 November 2021) that will be implemented before 31 December 2023.

Member States are requested to provide a breakdown per third country from which resettlement or humanitarian admission is envisaged to take place. Providing further detail on the geographic origin/nationality of the persons to be resettled is optional and may not be readily available yet.

² For the purposes of the AMIF 2021-27, “humanitarian admission” entails the provision of rights and obligations equivalent to those of Articles 20 to 34 of the Qualification Directive (Dir 2011/95/EU) for beneficiaries of subsidiary protection - see Article 2(5) AMIF.

³ For the purposes of humanitarian admission under the AMIF 2021-27, the following vulnerable groups are relevant (Article 19(3) AMIF):

- (a) women and children at risk;
- (b) unaccompanied minors;
- (c) persons having medical needs that can be addressed only through humanitarian admission;
- (d) persons in need of humanitarian admission for legal or physical protection needs, including victims of violence or torture.
